

MISSING SUZY'S MUM SLAMS KIDNAP GAME

THE MOTHER of missing estate agent Suzy Lamplugh has condemned a theatre group's latest bizarre performances — for a fee they'll snatch you off the streets and hold you hostage.

The group, called Blast Theory, charges to "kidnap" people and then hold them captive at a secret location for up to 48 hours.

While being held, the volunteers

will be verbally abused and deprived of comforts. For an additional fee men volunteering can be seized by pretty girls and then kept naked or in underwear. They can face interrogation, or be massaged and bathed.

Dangerous

But Diana Lamplugh, whose 25-year-old daughter's disappearance in 1986 remains unsolved, said the Blast Theory plan sounded dangerous.

Diana, of Bermondsey, east London, began a trust to publicise the dangers of women working alone after Suzy went missing on a job in Fulham.

She said: "This is a blatant attempt to glamorise kidnapping.

"All these extra options sound like scenes from a horror film — except here it will be much more real.

"I would question why someone would want to do this in the first place."
